## Standards of Excellence

### Overview

It is the goal of Sigma Kappa Sorority that each Sigma Kappa Chapter provides a quality membership experience for its members. It should be an experience that will extend far beyond one's academic career. This goal can only be reached if each chapter's level of performance in all areas of chapter life is exemplary. Because national council is committed to the pursuit of excellence for each collegiate chapter, the Standards of Excellence (SOE) program was developed and has been updated to define excellence as it pertains to our values: personal growth, friendship, service, and loyalty.

The revised SOE program exemplifies what is both expected and desired on the part of each member and chapter. SOE can be used by every chapter on every campus to achieve the highest level of achievement in academic performance, leadership enhancement, skill development, and a variety of other aspects.

### Criteria

The criteria that make up the Standards of Excellence program are aligned with the Sigma Kappa values.

**Personal Growth:** Bound by a Promise to be the best person you can be.

**Friendship:** Bound by a Promise to demonstrate sisterhood and friendship throughout life.

**Service:** Bound by a Promise to model service and leadership in your communities, especially within Sigma Kappa.

**Loyalty:** Bound by a Promise to remain loyal to Sigma Kappa and to living its values in all that you do.

## Implementation

To insure the successful utilization of SOE the following steps should be taken:

1. Recognize the value of the Standards of Excellence program in serving as a tool to allow your chapter to reach its ultimate potential for success.
2. Utilize SOE as the basis for the setting of chapter goals with each member aware of its importance.
3. Utilize SOE as a source for identifying areas that need strengthening, inspiring creativity in programming, and bonding of members that is an ultimate outcome of vision accomplished.
4. Assign responsibility for the implementation of every individual criterion to a particular officer/committee chair or member.
5. Set dates for progress reports and deadlines for the accomplishments of specific tasks. If necessary use visual techniques to keep all members informed of progress.
6. Review accomplishments and upcoming events with advisor at executive council meetings.
7. Review SOE at meetings with both initiated members and new members; discuss goals and the chapter's present performance level.
8. Reward yourselves periodically for completion of designated categories, achievement surpassing a prior year's and/or excellence in an area of need.
9. Make a final review on accomplishments toward chapter goals at the officer transition workshop.

## Rating

The SOE award process is based on reporting by chapter officers. The process provides essential feedback to both the chapter and the national organization and determines award eligibility and level. The award is based on a calendar year and is judged by the collegiate district directors who then recommend to national council their decision regarding the Standards of Excellence, as appropriate. National council reviews these documents and recommendations and makes the final decision. Formal recognition occurs at national convention or College Officer Training School (COTS).

The collegiate district directors (CDD) in working with other Sigma Kappa national volunteers and staff members review reports from chapter officers and chairman and determine the number of points a chapter shall receive. Upon evaluating the criterion, the CDDs will combine the points to determine the level of achievement for each chapter.

The Standards are defined in a six level rating system. The three star Standards of Excellence is the highest level and the level to which each Sigma Kappa chapter should strive. The minimum standards level is the fundamental standard that each chapter must meet. The categories are as follows:

- **Three Star Standards of Excellence**
  - Chapter obtains 180-200 total points
- **Two Star Standards of Excellence**
  - Chapter obtains 170-179 total points
- **One Star Standards of Excellence**
  - Chapter obtains 160-169 total points
- **Minimum Standards**
  - Chapter obtains 150-159 total points
- **Below Standards**
  - Chapter obtains 140-149 total points
- **Critically Below Standards**
  - Chapter obtains 139 or fewer total points
