Sigma Kappa Sorority Announcement

It is with deep regret that the national council of Sigma Kappa Sorority announces the closure of the Zeta Nu Chapter (The University of Texas at San Antonio) effective May 24, 2017. The chapter has received years of dedicated support from both national headquarters staff and volunteers, but continued to struggle with low membership numbers and chapter operations.

Despite many years of hard and focused work by the chapter and dedicated support from national leadership, the Zeta Nu Chapter has been unable to meet organizational goals and expectations. All members in good standing will transition to alumnae status effective immediately and will retain the privileges of being a lifetime member of Sigma Kappa.

"It is never an easy decision to close a chapter," stated Sara Seely Chacon, national president. "When a chapter is not able to provide the quality collegiate member experience we expect for all Sigma Kappa sisters, then we must do what is best for Sigma Kappa and the Panhellenic community. Zeta Nu Chapter and members will remain a valued part of the Sigma Kappa sisterhood."

Sigma Kappa was established at the University of Texas at San Antonio in 1978. The Sorority looks forward to the opportunity to rejoin the strong fraternity and sorority community at UTSA in the future.

Sigma Kappa Sorority, founded in 1874, is a national not-for-profit organization of more than 165,000 women dedicated to excellence in academics, personal character, and service to society.
